The centre will be known as the Allan G Ezzy Community Centre after the former Holroyd councillor of 38 years and an official naming ceremony took place on Saturday 16th February to mark the occasion.



Holroyd City Mayor, Ross Grove, led the official proceedings and unveiled two

plaques on the day. Mayor Grove said: "The facilities at the community centre are top class and will be a great asset to the local community in Pemulwuy. The centre as a whole will offer a range of services to the local community with the children's centre providing much needed long day preschool and out of school hours care for local parents."

"The centre named after Allan as a gesture of thanks for all of his hard work and dedication over the years as a councillor and active member of the local community. He is very well thought of at the council and indeed in the area so it's only right that we should recognise his services to the community in this way."

Allan is Holroyd City's second longest serving councillor having first been elected in 1974 at the age of 32. He was mayor for nine one-year terms and deputy mayor for three one year terms. Allan said: "It's an absolute honour to have the centre named after me. I loved my role as a councillor - helping the community and being a spokesman - so it's very humbling to be recognised in this way and to be able to leave a lasting mark on the area."







# Masonic Architecture Series I

# George Washington Masonic Memorial



The George Washington Masonic Memorial was built in 1920s as a memorial and a museum highlighting the contributions of Freemasons to the United States and in honour of George Washington.

The two Lodges most closely associated with George Washington are Fredericksburg Lodge at Fredericksburg, Virginia, his Mother Lodge and Alexandria-Washington Lodge at Alexandria, Virginia, where he was elected Charter Master under the Grand Lodge of Virginia.

Through the generosity of Washington's family and friends, Alexandria-Washington Lodge became the repository of many artefacts of Washington and the Washington family. A fire in the Lodge in 1871 destroyed Washington artefacts and the lodge was no longer large enough to house the collection.

In 1909 Charles H. Callahan, the Senior Warden of Alexandria-Washington Lodge, purchased several lots of land which he gave to the Lodge for the site of a new Lodge Hall.

An invitation was then issued to every Grand Master in the United States to assemble in Alexandria-Washington Lodge on February 22, 1910 for the purpose of forming an association to plan and build a suitable Memorial to George Washington, the Mason. Twenty six Lodges were represented and approved and endorsed the erection of the Memorial. The George Washington Masonic National Memorial

Association had been formed.

Ten years later, the concept of a colossal building as a Memorial to Washington was approved by the Grand Lodges of the United States and the ground breaking ceremony took place on June 5, 1922 with the Memorial's cornerstone was dedicated in a Masonic ceremony on November 1, 1923.

Work on the Memorial continued throughout the Great Depression with Freemasons continuing to faithfully contribute to its construction and on May 12, 1932, the dedication of the Memorial took place with the participation of President Herbert Hoover.

After World War II the interior work on the memorial began in earnest and was finally completed in 1970. The large square and compasses on the front lawn were added in 1999.

The main entrance hall features a 17 ft. bronze statue of Washington and beautiful murals that depict the history of American Freemasonry.

This magnificent structure also serves as a research centre, a library, community centre, performing arts centre and concert hall, a banquet hall and meeting site for local and visiting Masonic lodges.




# Badges of the British Army

Club member John Fallows' shares his very memorable collection of every badge of the British Army at 1956 when he chose to close his collection because after 1956 Regiments of the British Army were either disbanded or amalgamated.

"My collection began when an uncle I never knew would write home from somewhere in the Middle East to his sister (my mother) and include a badge - 'for the little bloke' - who was about five years old."

As his interest in Military history grew John decided to add to his collection, from second hand shops, friends everywhere, until he arrived at the collection he has today. "I look at my badges and find it hard to believe that famous Regiments - the Black Watch, the Gordons, the Fusliers, the Light Infantry don't exist today. So much history and tradition wiped out with the flourish of a pen.'
