## METRO MOVES

Plans are in top gear now for the demolition of the building adjoining the NSW Masonic Club. This is the first demolition planning works will begin phase of clearing the Castlereagh, Park and Pitt Streets site for what will be called the "Pitt Street North Sydney Metro (underground) Station".
