Demolition works are about to commence next door to the Club building. We are very pleased to announce that The President, Stephen Bates, General Manager, Paul Brasch and with the assistance of Director, Peter Zeilic, negotiated a very beneficial Adjoining Owner Agreement with Transport for

NSW on behalf of the Club. The settlement agreed to was significant and includes payments for access fees, compensation towards double glazing of windows to reduce external noise and a contribution towards any loss of business that may be due to the scaffolding works over the next 11 months. The first item to be demolished in May will be the awning over 175 Castlereagh Street.


