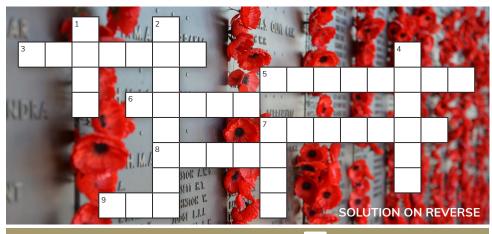
ANZAC CROSSWORD
